How is it relevant to your school context?

- **Peer Interaction:** Activities like *Mitra Milan* foster collaboration and can be incorporated into group projects or team-based learning exercises across subjects.

What could have been better?

More detailed planning and advance preparation could have improved the day's flow. Some activities could have been more structured, and additional time could have been allocated for each session to ensure that students fully immersed themselves in the learning process.

What was done well?

The variety of activities provided was impressive, catering to different interests and learning styles. The integration of patriotism and environmental responsibility into creative tasks was particularly well-received. Both students and teachers appreciated the opportunity to interact more freely, without the constraints of regular academic sessions. The day's execution was smooth, and the activities were engaging and meaningful.

Suggestions:

To make future *No Bag Days* even better, a wider variety of activities could be introduced, ensuring that students with different skills and interests are equally involved. More advance notice and detailed instructions for each session could help in managing time better and allowing students to fully engage with each task.
